

Brooklyn College Academy (BCA) is a small comprehensive 9th through 12th grade Early College High School established in 1986 by the NYC Board of Education in collaboration with the City University of New York. While at BCA, students receive a college preparatory curriculum and a strong guidance support system, including advisory, counseling, and parental involvement. Teachers at BCA meet regularly with students for individual progress updates and inform parents of the same in writing. Parent Teacher Association and Executive Board meetings are regularly scheduled throughout the year, as are School Leadership Team meetings.

Figure 1. BCA graduation rate vs. citywide high school graduation rate²

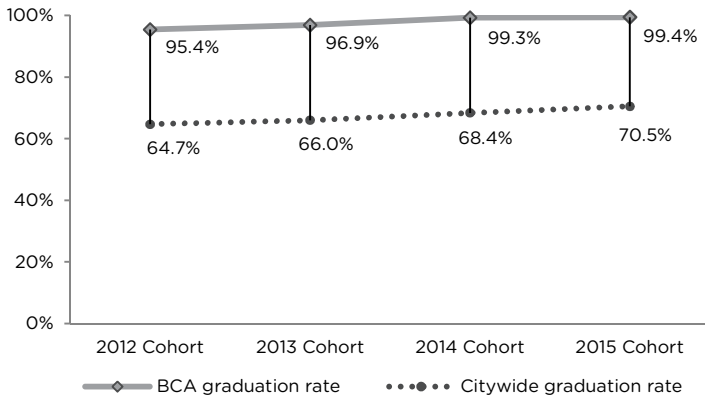
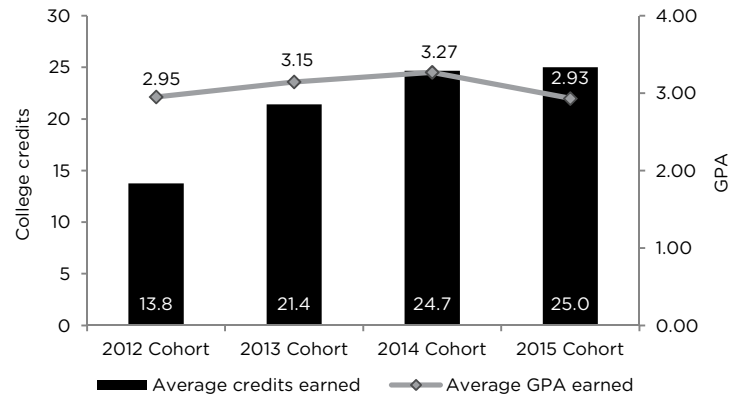


Figure 2. Average college GPA and college credits of graduates

Figure 3. BCA graduates vs. citywide college 6-month enrollment rate^{2,4}

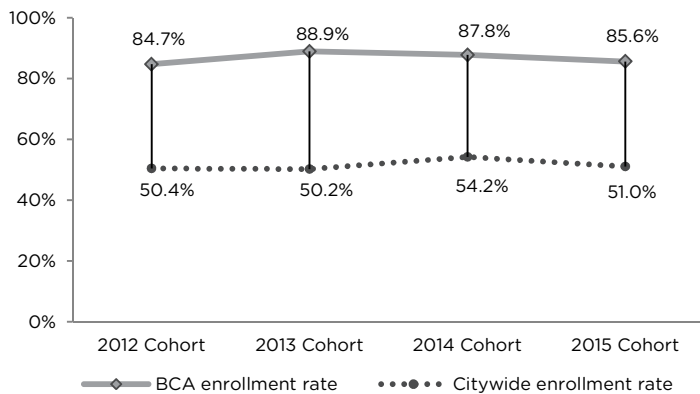
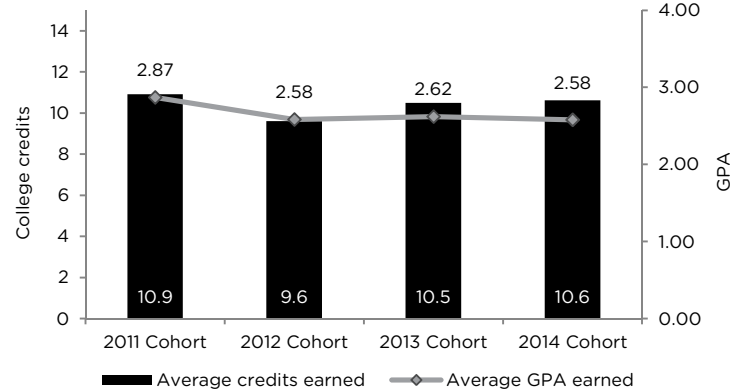


Figure 4. BCA graduates' average Fall semester college GPA and credits^{3,5}
