Figure 1. CCAA graduation rate vs. citywide high school graduation rate²

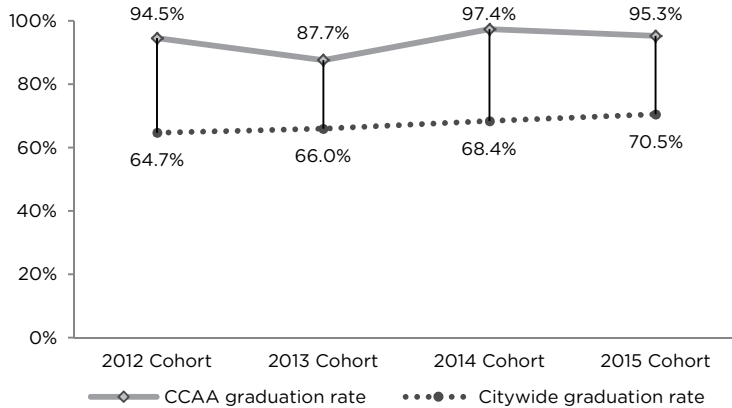
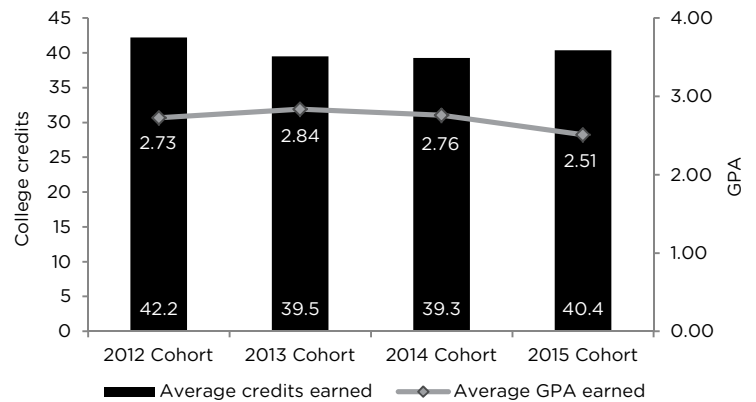


Figure 2. Average college GPA and college credits of graduates

Figure 3. CCAA graduates vs. citywide college 6-month enrollment rate^{2,4}

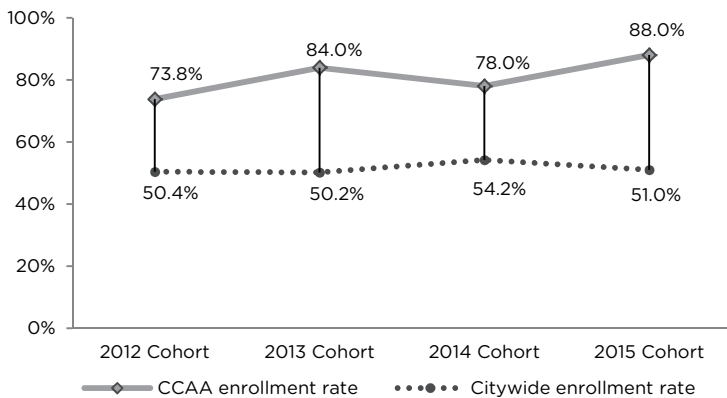
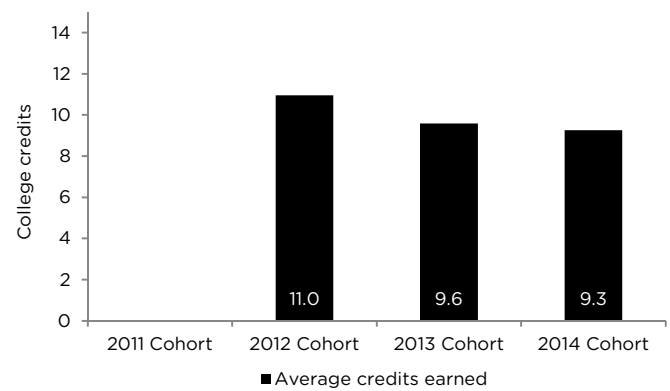


Figure 4. CCAA graduates' average Fall semester college credits earned^{3,5}
