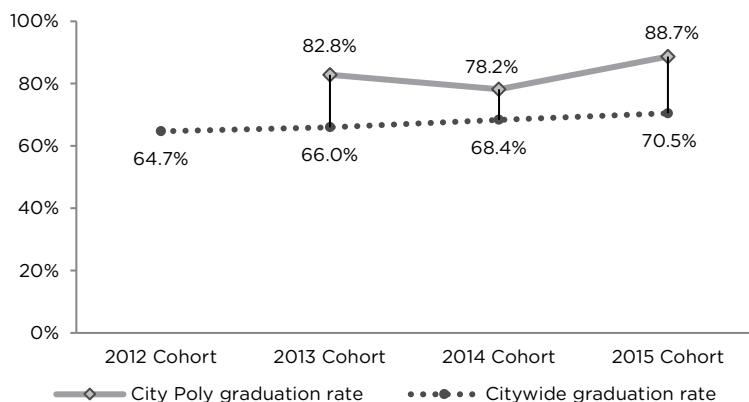

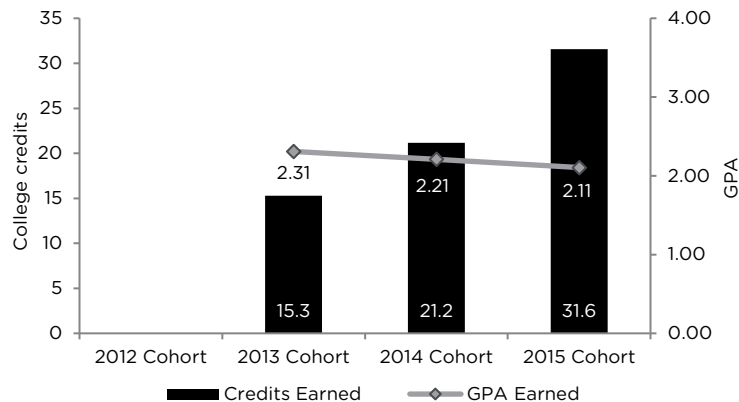

**Figure 1.** City Poly graduation rate vs. citywide high school graduation rate<sup>2,3</sup>

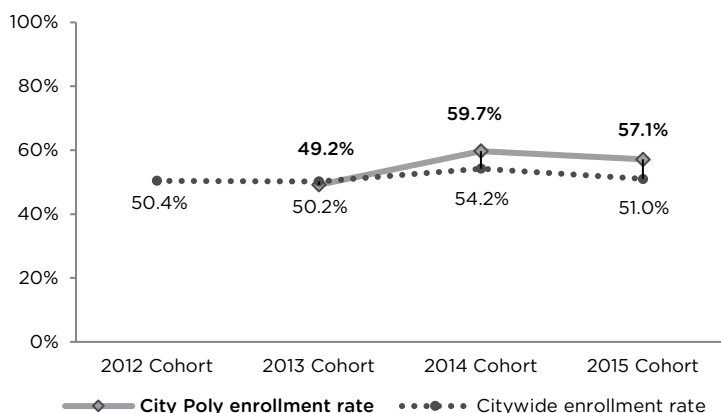


**Figure 2.** Average college GPA and college credits of graduates

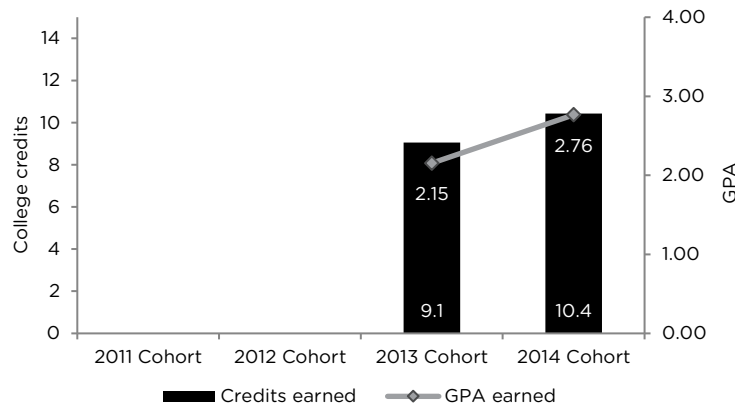
