Figure 1. MHSHS graduation rate vs. citywide high school graduation rate²

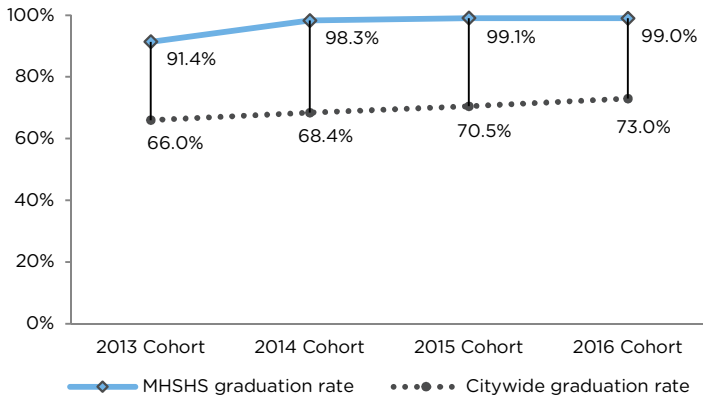
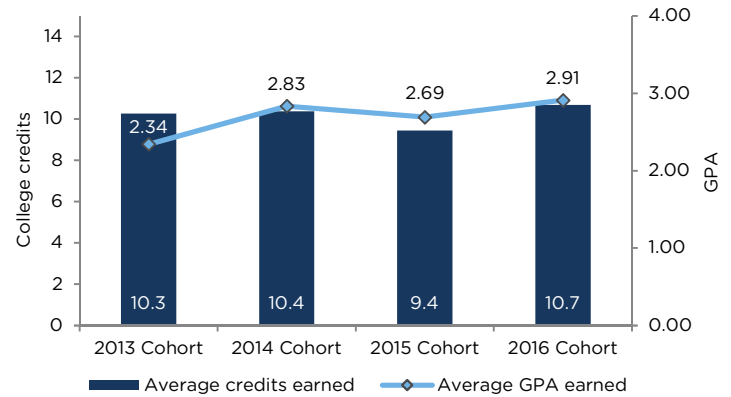


Figure 2. Average college GPA and college credits of graduates

Figure 3. MHSHS graduates vs. citywide college 6-month enrollment rate^{2,3,4}

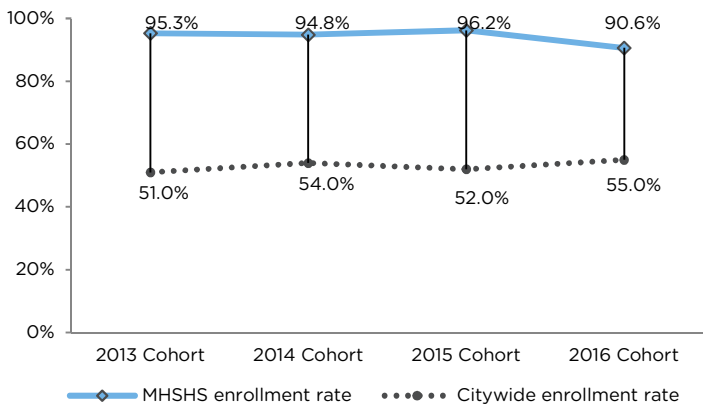
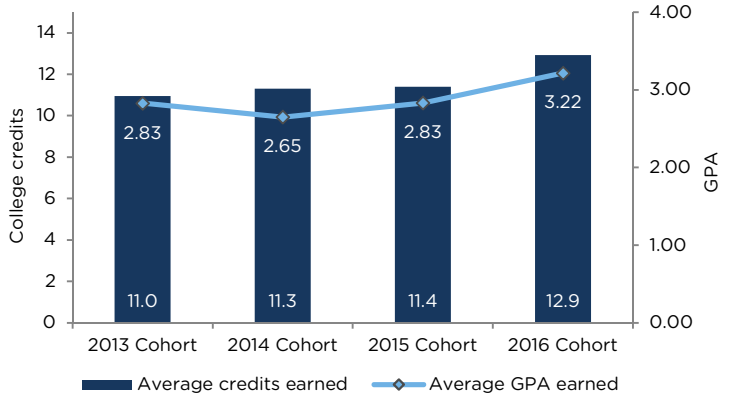


Figure 4. MHSHS graduates' average Fall semester college GPA and credits⁵
